

Cookies Policy

1. About cookies

- A cookie is a file containing an identifier (a string of letters and numbers) that is sent by a web server to a web browser and is stored by the browser. The identifier is then sent back to the server each time the browser requests a page from the server.
- Cookies may be either “persistent” cookies or “session” cookies: a persistent cookie will be stored by a web browser and will remain valid until its set expiry date, unless deleted by the user before the expiry date; a session cookie, on the other hand, will expire at the end of the user session, when the web browser is closed.
- Cookies do not typically contain any information that personally identifies a user, but personal information that we store about you may be linked to the information stored in and obtained from cookies.
- Cookies can be used by web servers to identify and track users as they navigate different pages on a website and identify users returning to a website.

2. Our cookies

- We use both session and persistent cookies on our website.

We use Cookie Consent to help us comply with the EU regulations regarding usage of website cookies.

3. Analytics cookies

- Our analytics service provider generates statistical and other information about website use by means of cookies.
- The information generated relating to our website is used to create reports about the use of our website.

- Most browsers allow you to refuse to accept cookies
- Blocking all cookies will have a negative impact upon the usability of many websites.

- If you block cookies, you will not be able to use all the features on our website

- You can delete cookies already stored on your computer;
- Deleting cookies will have a negative impact on the usability of many websites.

7. Data protection registration

- We are not registered as a data controller with the UK Information Commissioner's Office because we are a not for profit organisation. However, we will comply with all the elements of the GDPR regulation with reference to user's personal data, in so far as they are relevant to our organisation.
