

Use of a Bouncy Castle or other inflatable equipment in Hall

The use of a Bouncy Castle in the Large Hall for children's parties is allowed by the Hall Committee but the Committee DOES NOT accept any responsibility for its use.

It is the duty of the hirer to make sure that this is done safely and without damage to hall fixtures and fittings.

To assist you in making sure that there is room for your proposed apparatus, please see photograph below which gives main dimensions of the Hall. You should also note that roof trusses are approximately 3.5m apart.



Hirers should conduct a risk assessment of using a bouncy castle in the Hall. Some things to consider are :-

- Will the castle fit into the Hall. Is there enough headroom to prevent children injuring themselves?
- Where will you plug the Castle Inflator/fan into the mains? - What steps will you take to make sure that there is no trip hazard from trailing cable(s)?
- Electrical Safety – is the Inflator/fan and its cable electrically safe, has the equipment been PAT tested (ask your supplier). What steps will you take to prevent your guests tampering with the equipment?
- How will you prevent the castle from moving round the hall when it's inflated?
- When people get off the castle is there a soft landing area?
- How many people will you allow on the castle at any one time?
- How will you ensure that the castle will be supervised by a responsible adult at all times and any unsafe behaviour/activities are stopped immediately?
